

Geely Automobile Holdings Limited
SALES VOLUME FOR OCTOBER 2017 REACHED ANOTHER RECORD HIGH LEVEL OF
125,118 UNITS
SALES VOLUME UP 30% YOY

(HONG KONG, 6 November 2017) --- Geely Automobile Holdings Limited ("Geely Automobile"/the "Group")(Stock code: 175) announced that the total sales volume of the Group for the month of October 2017 reached another record high level of 125,118 units, an increase of approximately 30% over the same period last year and up around 15% from September 2017. The Group's exports volume was down around 32% year-on-year to 758 units in the month of October 2017. During the month of October 2017, the Group's total sales volume in the China market was 124,360 units, an increase of around 31% from the same period last year. The total sales volume in the first ten months of 2017 was 952,226 units, an increase of approximately 72% from the same period last year, and achieving around 87% of the Group's revised full year sales volume target of 1,100,000 units in 2017.

The Spokesman of Geely Automobile said, "During the month of October 2017, the sales volume of 'New Emgrand' was 27,033 units, an increase of about 8% from the same period last year. The sales volume of 'Vision' sedan was 11,571 units in October 2017, a decrease of about 26% from the same period last year. During the month of October 2017, all the Group's four new models launched in 2016 maintained high levels of sales volumes, three of which reached record high monthly sales volume during the month: The 'Geely Boyue' (吉利博越) recorded a sales volume of 30,138 units; the 'Emgrand GS' (帝豪GS), its first crossover SUV model, recorded a sales volume of 16,063 units; whereas the 'Emgrand GL' (帝豪GL), its new generation of A+ segment sedan model, recorded a sales volume of 13,513 units. The 'Vision SUV' (遠景SUV), its new SUV model, recorded a sales volume of 11,214 units."

The sales volume figures released are based on a more stringent recognition criterion, requiring all sales to be contracted, paid and delivered before it would be recognized. These figures, however, are preliminary figures and will be subject to changes and final confirmation.
